EASTER HARE TALES

Ages 7+



Working under the creative collective moniker of 'The Heckleburn Quines', visual artist Mel Shand, ceramicist Hilary Duncan and basket maker Helen Jackson will lead an exciting mixed-media session inspired by their own 'Easter Hare Tale'.

Using artist Albrecht Durer's sitting hare and her own paintings of wild hares for inspiration, Mel will lead guests through simple monoprinting techniques to draw or trace a hare, and apply surface decoration with botanical shapes and feathers.

Using one of the hare drawings as a template, Hilary will then support participants to make a ceramic Easter hare plaque, decorated using traditional techniques such as sgraffito, sprigging and embossing.

Helen will share her basket making and willow weaving skills to demonstrate how to make woven leaf platters, using rush, willow, birch and larch, upon which Easter treasures can be laid. EASTER SUNDAY
